Our dedicated and enthusiastic staff have consistently met—and often surpassed—the developmental goals they set, thereby maintaining a benchmark of excellence across all spheres of activity.

Brief History of the College

Situated in the idyllic and picturesque Pabbar Valley, near the Mata Hateshwari Temple, LBS Government Degree College (GDC) Saraswati Nagar serves as an institution that shapes the future and directs the aspirations of its students towards successful careers and higher life goals.

Established in 1986, LBS Government College, Saraswati Nagar, has emerged as an institution of eminence in Himachal Pradesh. The opening of the college in such a challenging geographical region marked the beginning of a new intellectual climate for the entire area. Since its inception, the college has provided diverse opportunities for local youth, enabling them to acquire the skills and confidence necessary to meet global challenges.

The college has made significant strides under its motto: *“To provide a distinct environment of excellence in education with humane values and social commitment.”*

In the 2019–20 session, postgraduate (PG) courses in Political Science and History were introduced. During 2023–24, the college expanded its PG offerings to include English, Hindi, and Commerce, alongside the introduction of the Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) in Retail Management and Hospitality & Tourism Management.

BRIEF OVERVIEW OF THE COLLEGE

Educational Facilities and Courses Offered

a. Undergraduate (UG) Level:

The college currently offers five UG pass courses: BA, BSc, BCom, BCA, and BVoc in Retail Management and Hospitality & Tourism Management. Both vocational courses follow the semester system.

b. Postgraduate (PG) Level:

The college provides postgraduate courses in Political Science, History, English, Hindi, and Commerce. Student enrolment in these courses has shown a steady increase, yielding excellent academic results. Additionally, a self-financing PGDCA course is operational.

Infrastructural Facilities

We have significantly upgraded our infrastructure and remain committed to continuous improvement, ensuring our students have access to modern facilities and exposure that are second to none. Our achievements include:

- **Significant Accolades:** The college has received substantial special grants amounting to several crores for the construction of a Multipurpose Hall, a new Academic Block, an Indoor Stadium, and the levelling of the playground for sports activities.
- **Library:** The college houses a spacious and comprehensive library catering to the educational and recreational needs of students and staff. It contains approximately 13,892 books, including a book bank. The library subscribes to seven newspapers, eight magazines, and five journals. It is a member of INFLIBNET (Ahmedabad) and NDLI (Kharagpur), and is automated using SOUL 3.0 software. Furthermore, it has been converted into a Digital Library with ten dedicated computers.
- **Laboratories:** There are four spacious Science laboratories, including a Geography laboratory and an English Language laboratory.
- **Girls' Hostel:** The on-campus hostel provides boarding facilities for meritorious and deserving students. It is equipped with water purifiers, solar heating systems, a sick room, a guest room, and a reading room.
- **Computer Laboratories:** To keep pace with a high-tech and competitive world, the college is equipped with 100 computers across an English language laboratory and three IT laboratories. These facilities feature overhead projectors and broadband connectivity, benefiting students across all faculties.

- **Seminar/Conference Hall:** The college possesses a well-furnished seminar hall for hosting meetings, conferences, and academic seminars.
- **Canteen:** The college canteen serves as a refreshment hub for staff and students, offering a variety of food items and snacks at nominal prices.
- **Playground and Athletic Track:** The college grounds facilitate various outdoor games such as volleyball, kabaddi, and boxing. The athletic track is a significant asset to the institution.
- **Gymnasium:** Recognizing the importance of fitness in a stressful era, the college provides a complimentary gymnasium for students and staff.
- **Pavilion:** The college boasts a magnificent pavilion building adjacent to the grounds, providing an excellent vantage point for sports events.

Other Facilities

- Wi-Fi connectivity, INFLIBNET access, biometric attendance systems, and CCTV surveillance.
- Installed water purifiers and coolers throughout the campus.
- Integration of modern technology through an E-Resource Centre in the library and well-furnished Smart Classrooms equipped with digital teaching boards.
