ANNUAL REPORT 2018-19

The college was established in July 1986 to cater to the higher educational needs specifically of the rural area so as to enable of the people of this area. The opening of this college in such a hard area was a step towards therealization of higher educational requirements of the local youth. Since then this college has been providing various opportunities for the youth of this area and has been enabling them to acquire skills and confidence to keep pace with changing scenarion. The college has come a long way with its motto *“To provide adistinct environment of excellencein education with humane values & social commitment”*.

Teaching & Non-Teaching Staff Position

At preset there are four(04) associate Professors , twenty Assistant professors (20) , One (01) Asstt. Librarian and 13 (Thirteennon Teaching staff member) are working in the institution.

Twenty five (25) posts of teaching staff including that of Principal have been sanctioned, out of which one post of Asst. Professor in Physicsis presently lying vacant and one post of Librarian is also lying vacant .

Out of twenty four (24) sanctioned posts of non -teaching staff, eight posts are lying vacant viz. one post each of , mechanic, tablawadak, JLA and three posts of peon cum chowkidar, 2 posts of part –time water carrier / Animal Collector.

Results

The results of the session 2017-18 of the B.A., B.Sc. B.Com 6th semester was 100%.

Scholarships

The college awards scholarship to the IRDP and SC/ST/OBC/Minorities students every year. In this session, an amount of Rs1,60,000/- (One Lac sixty thousand for 40 SC students, an amount of Rs. 4800/ (Four thousand and eight hundred only) for 4 IRDP/OBC students and an amount of Rs. 1,05,000 (Rupees one lac five thousand only) for 07 students under KalpanaChawla scholarship scheme is under process.

RUSA Grant

A sum of Rs.1,00,00,000/- (One Crore only) was received from RUSA under “ Infrastructure Grant. The grant is in the process of utilization.

Library

The college has a voluminous and spacious Library which caters to the educational and recreational needs of both students and the staff. It has about 11,269 books on different subjects. It subscribes to 6 newspapers and 18 periodicals to facilitate the teaching learning process of students and staff members. The college is also a member of Inlibnet Ahmedabad. 367 new books were added during the session with more emphasis on competitive books.

4. Initiating the proposal for the construction of Boys’ Hostel .
